Words from Pastor Fran

Great is the Lord! He is most worthy of praise! No one can measure His greatness. Psalm 145:3 (NLT)

We are nearing the Lenten season! A season of remembering who we are, but more importantly, remembering who the Lord is. We offer our thanks and praise for Jesus!

This year, we will be working our way through a study titled, *Let My People Go*. This series is based on Rev. Dr. Reed Lessing's book titled, *Deliver Us: God's Rescue Story in Exodus*.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14, 2024, and so does our emphasis on Moses' book *Exodus*. We've heard the story so many times. Moses asks Pharaoh to let God's people go seven times (Exodus 5:1; 7:16; 8:1, 20; 9:1, 13; 10:3) and Pharaoh finally does it! When he does, God's salvation is so amazing that the event becomes the Gospel of the Old Testament. Israel's Scriptures mention the exodus 125 times!

Throughout the book of Exodus God reveals who He is through His absence and His presence, through His silence and His speech, through His wrath and His mercy, and through His judgment and His amazing grace. In doing so, the book paints a beautiful portrait of *Jesus*. (See pg. 3 for a complete listing of each week's theme through Lent.)

Our mission highlight for this month is POBLO (People of the Book Lutheran Outreach). **Minnesota POBLO Mission**

Minnesota's foreign-born population has increased dramatically in recent years, with an influx of immigrants from Somalia, Laos, and India, among other countries. Nearly 100,000 refugees have come to Minnesota over the past three decades, and the state is home to the largest population of Somali Muslims in the U.S. As of 2011, more than 7% of the state's population was foreign born, and in 2006, Minnesota became the first U.S. state to elect a Muslim representative to Congress. 80% of the foreign-born population is concentrated in the Twin Cities region, where POBLO's Minnesota missionaries are based.

In Minnesota, POBLO missionaries and volunteers are involved in missions and community engagement through various efforts. Volunteers teach English, sewing, and computer skills to immigrants and refugees at three International Friendship Centers. Citizenship classes are also offered. Missionaries, together with a group of volunteers, are connecting people from many countries to Bible study and worship as they share the Gospel message. They also provide food, clothing, and furniture to refugees in need. All people need Jesus! (poblo.org)

Mitten Tree

If you worshiped in person during December, and into the New Year, you likely noticed our mitten tree was graced with an abundance of donations as follows:

36 pairs of mittens (the majority hand knit by Marilyn Nelson's brother, Jim)

6 pairs of gloves • 17 caps • 2 ear muffs • 1 pair fleece lined leggings

At the Women of Hope meeting on Jan. 13, it was decided, out of 5 options offered, that these donations would be delivered to our neighbors "Oasis" housed at Oak Grove Presbyterian Church, on the corner of Penn Ave. and Old Shakopee Road. "Oasis for Youth" opens the door to housing, employment, education, and wellness, for youth, ages 16 - 24, who are facing homelessness in the south suburbs of Hennepin County. It is considered a "Drop in Center" and provides basic necessities such as clothing, pantry & hygiene items, meals, access to a shower and laundry, and a safe place to take a nap. May the recipients be blessed by your donations to our mitten tree, and Thank You!

VEAP Update

Our first delivery to VEAP in 2024, was **68 lbs** on Jan. 11th. Thank you for your continued support, as the need is ongoing.



I attended a **Mission Partner Gathering**, on Sat. Jan. 20th, which was very well attended. VEAP, was founded in 1974, by 13 church bodies, which means this year they are celebrating 50 years of serving the community. A celebration is being planned, to be held in VEAP's parking lot, with food trucks, etc. so I will keep you posted, when details become available.

March is always the **"BIG Food & Fund Drive"** with the dates beginning Feb. 26th thru Apr. 6th. The goal this year is to receive 100,000 pounds of food, and \$300,000.

In 2023: **25,000** individuals were served—with children and seniors high on that list. **6 million pounds of food** was distributed. **2.8 million pounds of fresh produce** was distributed. **215 appointments** are made & provided for each day (permitted to come twice a week). **578 households** were served through their Social Services Dept.(financial assistance lasts 3 months)

Volunteers are always needed, and there are various opportunities from sorting incoming products, to answering phones. To volunteer, you must be 16 years old, and there are mostly flexible hours.

VEAP has laid out a guideline of different items for each month, so I will try to keep us informed of what the item for the month is. For February they are requesting items for a birthday bag. You can put together a kit, or just donate various items, such as cake mixes, frosting mixes, candles, paper plates, party napkins, little favors. And as I already mentioned, March will be the big food drive, but they will take anything you care to donate, at any time. Keep in mind \$30.00 will feed one person for one month. Following the informational meeting, we received a tour of the facility.

It's February already! The month of Love! It's hard to believe that I have been the Director of the Preschool and Childcare for 5 months already. A lot has been accomplished, but there is much left to do. I want to start by thanking some congregational members who have been continuing to help me in the massive clean-up and organization of the preschool. Renata Melby, Laurel Schaefer, Ina Adams, Linda and Orphah Borgen, Linda

Carstens, Corinne Condon, Linda Quittschreiber, and Kathy Sundseth. All of your efforts have meant so much to me and every hour you have spent cleaning and sorting was one less hour that I had to spend. Your help also provided some mental health relief as it can get lonely working alone! Thank you for your help and support! May God bless you, as you have been a blessing!

Many thanks to everyone who has contributed financially to the new Toddler Room. There was \$72.00 collected in the noisy offering the first Sunday of January, the women of Hope donated \$1000.00, and Darlene Wendt and Laurel Schaefer also gave some very generous gifts. We have now raised a total of \$3,000.00 or 30% of our goal! What a blessing! The people of Mt. Hope are so generous and it warms my heart!

Melanie Collins and Barbara Prigge gave notice right before Christmas Vacation and their last days were on January 5. Melanie told me that she wanted to try something different and Barbara is staying home to care for her husband Roger. His health has been deteriorating and it is much harder to take care of his needs than before.

Since Melanie and Barbara both quit, I began teaching every morning, as well as developing the Lesson Plans. The parents have been very pleased with the direction of the preschool and the children really seem to enjoy all the new activities I have prepared for them. I have been taking pictures of the children in the classroom. As I get time, I will develop them, post them in the narthex, and let you see what we are doing.

I have been working with First Children's Finance to try and get a grant for the toddler room, as well as a loan. If we receive a grant, it can be used for equipment and curriculum. The loan is to cover the cost of hiring and employing people until the room generates income. So far, there have been no grants available at this time. Kirsten is working to help me fill out a Business Analysis Worksheet for the possible loan.

We have begun getting calls for the fall and I have a couple of tours set up. I'm not sure how successful I will be getting children for the toddler room without the proper equipment, but I will keep trying. That's why your donations are so important! We need to get toddler-sized and developmentally appropriate toys and equipment. I will be working on putting together a board with some of the toys and equipment we will need. Take a look at it. Maybe something will catch your eye and you will feel the urge to purchase that piece of equipment or to put money towards it.

I am interested in setting up an early childhood committee to deal specifically with issues related to the Preschool and Childcare. There are some important jobs to do such as fundraising, marketing, and hiring. If anyone is interested in being on this committee, please contact me. It will definitely be a working committee as we work to provide a high-quality early childhood program for toddlers and preschoolers. One person cannot do all of this alone and I need your help. Thank you.

Richard and I are going to Mexico for the first two full weeks in February. This is an annual event as we own a timeshare in Mexico. We know how important it is to spend quality time away together from the stress of our jobs and we are looking forward to this. Unfortunately, I was not able to find a qualified teacher that I would be comfortable leaving the preschoolers with for two weeks, so we are not holding school for that time. I let the parents know earlier this month and no one has voiced any concerns. When I return, we will be scheduling an Open House to enroll new families for the fall. Please pray that God will send us children and families! And, eventually, new highly qualified, Christian staff!!
