# Words from Pastor Fran

I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them. Pray this way for kings and all who are in authority so that we can live peaceful and quiet lives marked by godliness and dignity. This is good and pleases God our Savior, who wants everyone to be saved and to understand the truth.

1 Timothy 2:1-3 (NLT)

As I sit and write this, we are only a few days removed from the assassination attempt on a former president. I'm sure you don't need me to tell you that the great divide in our country seems to only grow wider and with this attempt to take the life of Donald Trump, there doesn't appear to be any way for our nation to come together as one.

Yet, we must remember our Lutheran Theology of Two Kingdoms. James Madison wrote,

"...What is due to Caesar and what is due God, best promotes the discharge of both obligations."

Martin Luther wrote, "church leaders make poor kings and kings make poor bishops" (Luther's Works, 45:109). Luther recognized, on the basis of Jesus' words in the New Testament, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Mark 12:17), that there are two distinct realms.

The state is ruled by reason, and the church is ruled by the Word of God. Both are indeed God's, but He governs them differently. The one is the realm of Law and reason; the other is the Word of God and Gospel. We are citizens of Jesus' Kingdom and we are also citizens of the United States. Although there doesn't seem to be a chance to heal this great divide, our Holy Scriptures instruct us on the path forward.

Did you happen to read the message that our district president Rev. Dr. Lucas Woodford sent out with encouragement for all of us?

As Christian citizens, we are called to a higher standard. We are to love people and use politics, not the other way around. When Christians engage in malicious exchanges in the public square, it only demeans the Christian witness in the eyes of a jaded public. We are to refrain from vehemence, hatred, and any sinful behaviors, digital or otherwise, even as we participate in the political process and engage our civic duty with a good conscious. We are to be salt and light in a world of darkness and animosity (Matt. 5:13-14).

As we do, we must remember we are bound to the word of God, not a political party, nor any one candidate. As the Psalmist says, "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation." (Psalm 146:3). Christians recognize that no one political candidate has all the right answers; it's wrong to view anyone in messianic terms, blindly elevating him or her to god-like status.

Instead, the Apostle Paul directs us to esteem and pray for rulers and those in high positions, that all members of society may lead a peaceful and quiet life, dignified in every way.

There is perhaps, no better time to be a follower of Jesus! We live in a world of darkness and animosity, but Jesus empowers us by the Holy Spirit to live for Him, salt and light loving Him above all things and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Our world needs Jesus!

### **ALL THE DIFFERENCE**

Years ago, my husband and I had the good fortune to attend a presentation by the Rev. Richard Wurmbrand and his wife Sabina. Rev. Wurmbrand was the founder of *Voice of the Martyrs Ministries*, serving the persecuted church throughout the world. It was during the presentation, that Rev. Wurmbrand and Sabina shared their experiences as ones persecuted and imprisoned because of their Christian faith. This got me thinking back to what I wrote last month, how Christianity and the Bible are diminished in the eyes of the world today. And yet, how blessed we are in this county to be free to have Bibles and to worship.

It is through the Word that we learn of the Gospel of salvation, grace alone, through faith alone, and the nature of Jesus, the Christ, the Son of God. But recently, I am reading that there are some groups claiming to be "Christian" who might have a "different spirit" (2 Cor 11:4). In fact, there are many groups who call themselves "Christian" who add other writings which they consider equally authoritative; or they claim to continue to receive new revelations from God; or both. For them the Bible is not complete. Allow me to share some examples with you from one such religion:

I could go on, but I think you get the point. It might be one word or phrase that is written, but what is presented is a different Biblical Jesus. In fact, they are not even close. Here we see in these contrasting statements that there is a partial reliance on Jesus but a significant reliance on self. There is a rejection of the gospel which results in separation from God.

Christianity, on the other hand, teaches reliance on Jesus – Jesus + Nothing = Everything. This leads to eternal life with Him.

So, as we continue to be His disciples and to witness, we must pray for those not hearing what the Biblical Jesus says, and we must remain faithful to His Truth.

Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy, to the only God and Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. (Jude 24-25, NASB) AMEN


On June 6th Bob Tolzin, David Schleifer, Fran Wallin and Pastor Fran met with some leaders from St. Michaels Lutheran Church. This was an introductory meeting with the goal of trying to find ways our churches can strengthen each other by working together. Below are some notes from the meeting that both churches wanted to share with their respective congregations:

- ⇒ Mount Hope and St. Michael's have been meeting together, along with Redemption and Holy Emmanuel Lutheran Churches, to build relationships and begin talks about what "walking together" in ministry should look like in our current world environment.
- ⇒ Building on the idea of advancing partnership with local LCMS congregations, leaders from Mount Hope and St. Michael's gathered for an initial introduction on June 4th.
- ⇒ This initial introduction was a listening session where two different organizations could better understand respective needs and opportunities for partnership.
- ⇒ All Leaders recognized the importance of clear and transparent communication with their respective churches, which is the reason for this update.

Leaving this initial introduction, leaders agreed to:

- Pray to seek God's wisdom and clarity
- Share this update with each respective organization
- Consider a future session to think together on how these two organizations could start walking alongside each other in greater partnership to advance His kingdom

Our plan is for these leaders to continue to meet. We will continue to share with the congregation the information discussed at these meetings. If you have any questions, please contact one of the individuals listed above. We will also be discussing this topic at our fall Voter's meeting.
